The Requiem Mass takes its name from the first Latin word of the Introit (Entrance Verse) for this celebration, “Requiem” meaning “rest”.

At tonight’s Mass we plead the merits of the one eternal sacrifice that our Lord Jesus Christ offers to the Father, for the souls of past Vicars, benefactors and parishioners of All Saints’ Church and for the souls of many loved family members of present parishioners whose names are printed in this Mass Book.

This Mass, while solemn, is not morbid. We pray to God, commanding all these souls to his mercy, with great confidence and absolute trust. The black vestments worn are not a sign of sorrow or grief, rather they are a reminder to us of the special dignity of the dead and our hope for them as they await the fullness of the revelation of the glory of God – just as we do ourselves.

Saint Ambrose has this to say of the faithful departed, “We have loved them in life, let us not forget them in death.” A Requiem Mass is a powerful statement of our belief in the truth that “as in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive.” (1 Corinthians 15: 22) We pray with faith and confidence that our loved ones are indeed alive unto Christ in the mystery of his glorious resurrection.

This Requiem Mass is offered for the repose of the souls of all departed clergy, benefactors and parishioners of this Parish, and the repose of the souls of the following departed family and friends.

THE EPISTLE

Romans 5: 5-11

Hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit which has been given to us.
